Performance Returns

For the month of February 2017 the Drakens Africa ex S.A. UCITS Fund returned 2.52% against a 0.62% decline in the benchmark Standard & Poor's All Africa ex-South Africa Index.

Investment Objective & Strategy

Drakens Capital employs a long only equity strategy with a heavy focus on sustainability that is the result of two decades of investing in emerging markets. The investment philosophy at Drakens Capital is distilled into a four factor investment valuation model that encompasses Socially Responsible Investing, Risk, Quality and Value. The Fund invests in equities which derive the majority of earnings from the African continent, with the exception of those listed in South Africa. The tremendous growth opportunities found on the continent provide a rapidly expanding pool of investment opportunities. Growth and volatility often go hand in hand hence the Fund's measured and systematic investment approach seeks to tap into the emergence of the African continent whilst mitigating the risks associated with the Africa Rising story.

Market Commentary

Egypt dominated market movements for the fund's universe in February; both in terms of currency and equity prices. The rally in the equity market that lasted the past three months came to an end with profit taking pushing the market 5.8% lower in local currency for the month. The currency however had a phenomenal rally taking it from levels of EGP18.90 to the USD down to EGP15.80 by month end. The net result was an 11.8% gain in the equity market in USD terms. This currency strengthening is seen as an indication that the recent economic reforms that included floating the currency are starting to have the desired effects. This rally contributed roughly 3% to the fund's return for the month, and roughly 1.4% to its active return relative to the benchmark due to both the overweight position and a strong selection effect.

Across in West Africa, the Central Bank of Nigeria took a step closer to devaluation as it announced it will provide 23 commercial banks with a total USD370.8 million at a forward exchange rate 20% above that of the interbank rate. This move is believed to be an attempt to lower the parallel rate closer to the interbank rate in preparation for a proper devaluation. The country has been increasing its foreign reserves at a rapid rate in recent months and achieved a trade surplus in February on the higher oil price and increased oil production. Nigeria is thus better positioned to return to a more orthodox currency policy. We believe that if this is managed correctly it could lead to a similar rally as seen in Egypt. Without any visibility as to when this might happen however, the equity market is battling to find any support, drifting 2.7% lower in February.

In the fund's other key markets we saw a 2.2% market gain in Kenya on the back of a strong start to the earnings season and despite concerns around drought conditions. This assisted the fund's absolute and relative returns due to the overweight position. In Morocco, profit taking pushed the market 2.6% lower which detracted from the fund's absolute performance, but benefited the active return due to the underweight position. Amongst the foreign listed mining and oil producing stocks, the fund benefited as a higher gold price lifted the holding in Randgold Resources. The fund's active return also benefited from not being invested in First Quantum – the Zambian Copper miner listed in Canada which makes up roughly 5% of the benchmark – which fell 16% on operating concerns.

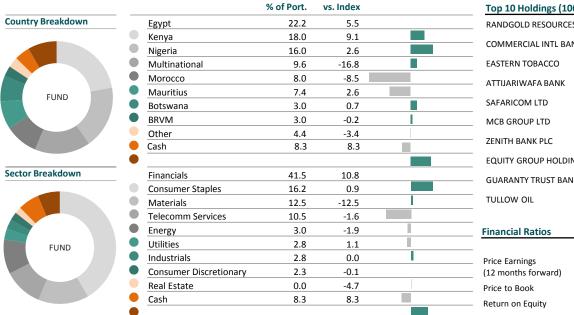
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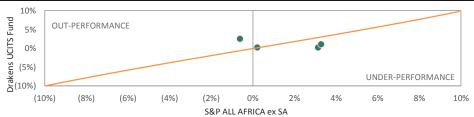
